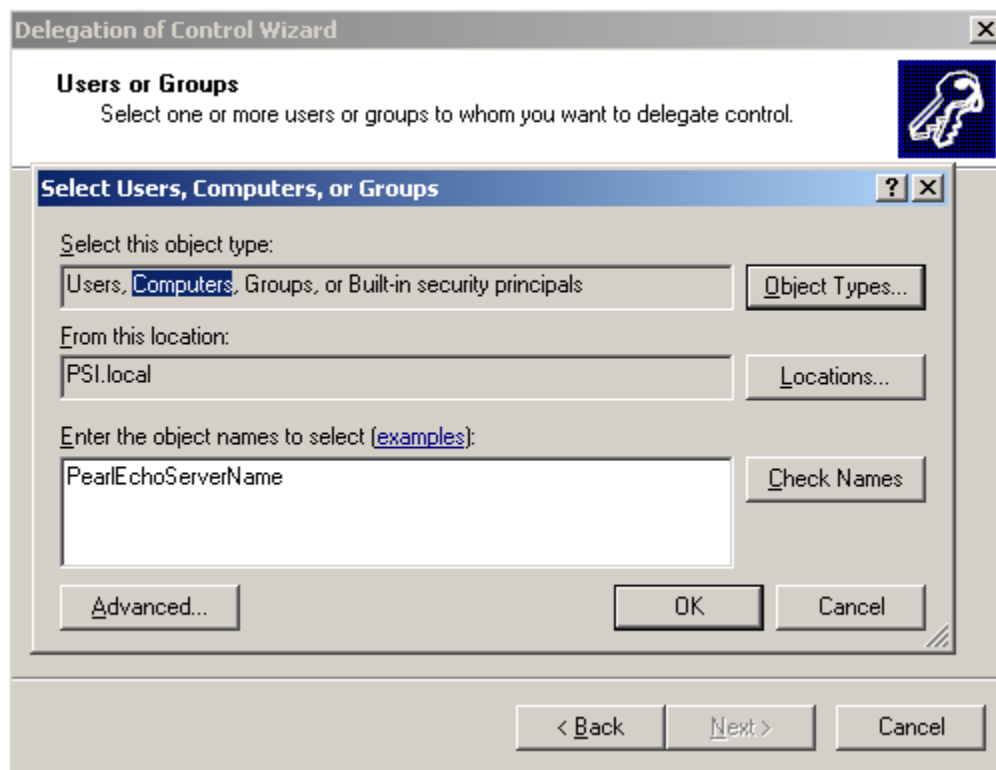


How to Assign Permissions to Allow a Domain Computer to Read SBS 2003 Active Directory Group Members

Microsoft Small Business Server does not assign the same default Active Directory LDAP read permissions as Windows 2000, 2003, etc. The following instructions demonstrate how to allow AD read access to a specific computer that is part of the SBS domain.

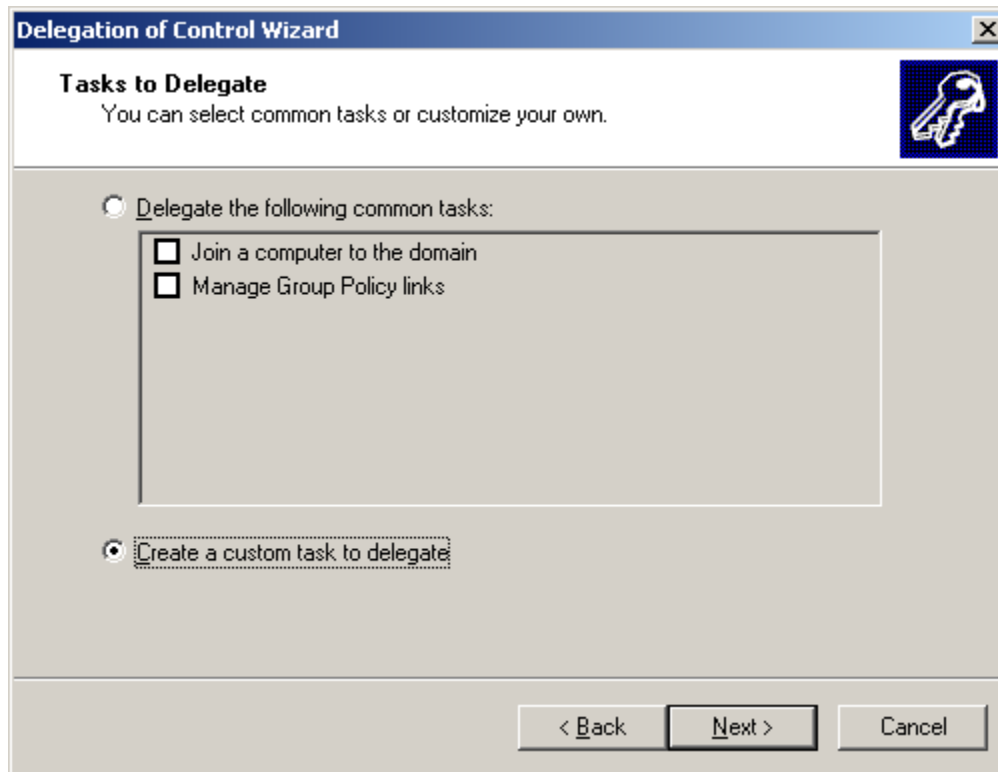
Note: These steps are not required with Active Directory on a standard Windows server or if your Pearl Echo Server is running on your SBS 2003 Server.

1. In **Active Directory Users and Computers**, right-click on the **root** of the tree for the domain, select All Tasks > **Delegate Control...**
2. Click **Next** in the Delegation Wizard.
3. Click **Add**. Select **Object Types...** Select **Computers**. Click **OK**.
4. In the "Enter the object names to select" box, enter the **computer name** of the Pearl Echo Server.

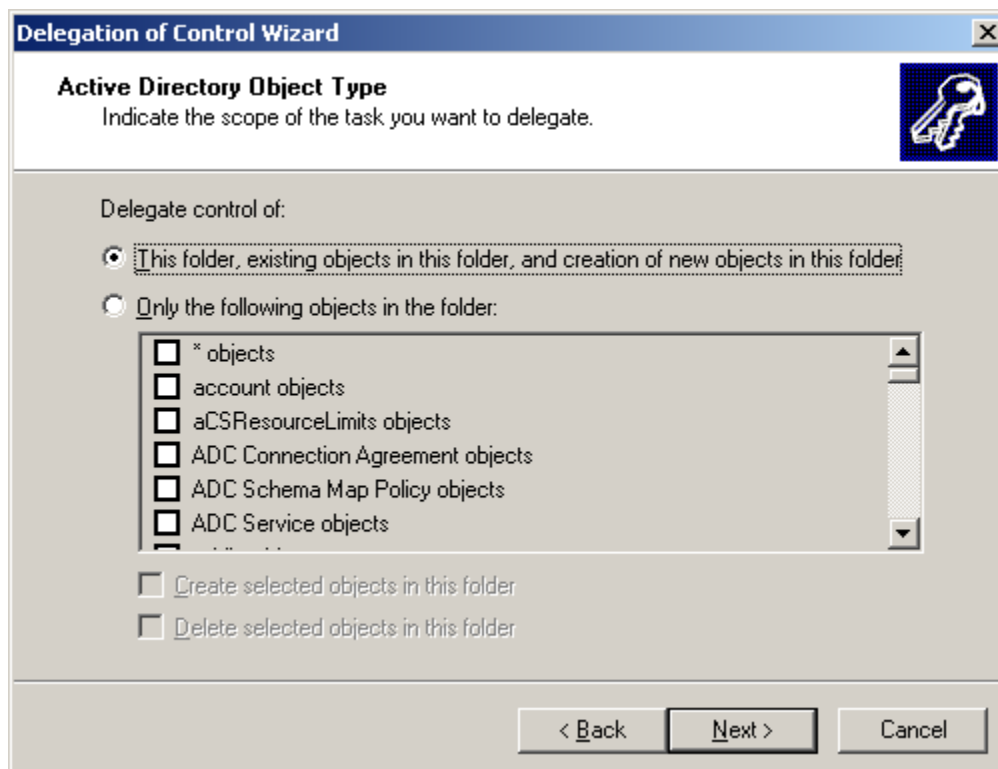


5. Click **Ok**. Click **Next**.

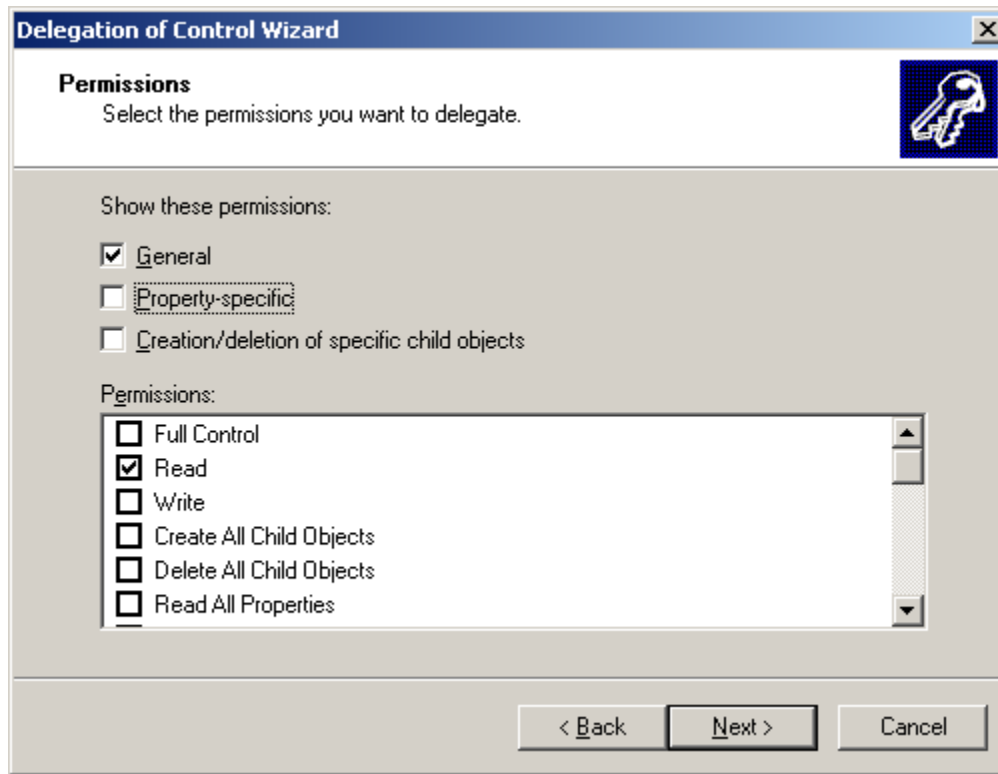
6. Select “Create a custom task to delegate” and click **Next**.



7. Select the default, “Delegate control of **This folder, existing objects in this folder...**” and click **Next**.



8. Select **General** and **Read** and click **Next**.



9. Select **Finish**.
